## **2024 Editor Report Presented to the ARIA Board August 2024**

The editorial office of the *Journal of Risk and Insurance (JRI)* has been housed in the Wisconsin School of Business at the University of Wisconsin-Madison since January 2019. Below we offer our final annual report, following six interesting and exciting years.

### **Key Highlights**

- We continue to encourage submissions of high-quality manuscripts, including through calls for papers, dual submission process with the Risk Theory Society, author outreach, posting to social media, and reviewer recognition;
- We have a prior review process intended to make submissions easier and quicker;
- Wiley has been accommodating with our desired expansions to their Decision Term Harmonization effort, an improvement since our report in January;
- The Mehr Award was again determined through a multi-step process as described below;
- Submission is strong, and publication statistics continue to be reasonable.

### **1. JRI Initiatives**

The editorial team undertook a number of recent initiatives. Among them are:

#### **a. Calls for Papers**

i. We issued a call for papers in 2023, *Algorithmic Bias and Fairness in Insurance: Testing, Industry Impact, and Regulatory Challenges*. We received 7 submissions before the June 2024 deadline: 3 were desk rejected, 1 was offered Reject and Resubmit, and 3 are in process. We may well decide not to publish a special call, and simply deal with these papers as regular submissions, given the low number of submissions.

ii. The *Role of Government vs. Private Sector Provision of Insurance* call for papers closed on November 1. We received 27 submissions: 3 were accepted, 4 have been offered Major Revision, 18 were rejected, and 2 were offered Reject and Resubmit.

iii. The special issue *The Economics of Emerging Insurance Technologies: Theory and Early Evidence* may be published in December if the process moves along. We received 28 submissions; 19 were ultimately rejected, 4 were offered Reject and Resubmit, 3 have been accepted, and we are waiting for 2 more to return after Major Revision.

iv. The special issue *Climate Change and Natural Disasters* was published in June, making it the second issue devoted to a single topic in two years.

b. Dual Submission with Risk Theory Society

We partnered with the Risk Theory Society again this year to offer authors the opportunity to submit papers both to the RTS and to the *JRI* without having to become a member of ARIA.

In the past two years, authors of 26 papers indicated an interest in the dual submission. Of those, 15 sets of authors were invited to submit to the *JRI*, and to date, 10 have followed through with submissions. The other manuscripts were either too early or outside of the scope of the *JRI*. All authors were notified of our decisions. Of the 10 who submitted to the *JRI*, 2 have been decided major revision, 3 have been offered reject and resubmit, 2 have been rejected, 1 has been referred to Risk Management and Insurance Review, and 2 are in process.

c. Author Outreach

In the past year, *JRI* has implemented several efforts to connect with authors. Our goals are to spread awareness about *JRI* and ARIA. These efforts include:

i. We are informing authors that their papers have been cited in work recently posted on Early View or in recent *JRI* issues. We email a notice to them along with a copy of the paper that cites their work.

ii. We have spent time searching SSRN for papers that may be suitable for publication in *JRI* by authors who are not currently ARIA members, and invite the authors to consider submitting their future research to *JRI*. We had hoped to encourage greater awareness of ARIA, yet did not find much success. Perhaps the next editor will do better.

d. Social Media

i. The *Journal* continues expanding its social media presence with LinkedIn posts. We have 2,513 followers on LinkedIn (2,128 at this time last year). We are grateful for Ph.D. candidate, Tyler Welch's, support in making LinkedIn successful.

ii. ARIA Communication Executive Cameron Madsen is, we believe, attempting to resurrect the *JRI* Influencer initiative, along with the ARIA Industry Outreach Committee. There have been some difficulties determining who has opted back in as influencers. In the meantime, Cameron has been posting *JRI* papers to ARIA's social media outlets.

e. Reviewer Recognition

The *JRI* is fortunate to have input from outstanding reviewers, some of whom are called on repeatedly because of the quality and depth of their comments. This year the editorial team recognized 16 individuals for their numerous, high-quality, and timely reviews. We appreciate the support of all of our reviewers in moving the profession forward while we specifically recognize Thomas Berry-Stoelzle, Martin Boyer, Alex Braun, David Dicks, Evan Eastman, Martin Eling, Stephen Fier, Mario Ghossoub, Rob Hoyt, Gene Lai, Andre Liebenberg, Peng Shi, Jeungbo Shim, Petra Steinorth, Tao Sun, and Nan Zhu.

f. [Prior Review](#)

The *JRI* has a process whereby authors of papers reviewed at top journals in economics, finance, statistics, and business are encouraged to submit their papers with the reviews and responses to those reviewers. In doing so, we anticipate that authors may experience a quicker and easier review process. Given the extremely low acceptance rates at these outlets, we recognize that many good papers are rejected at top journals. We would like to see them submitted to the *JRI*.

To date, 15 papers have been submitted using Prior Review. Five have been accepted, 2 have been offered resubmit opportunities, and 8 have been rejected.

g. Decision Term Harmonization

The *JRI* was transitioned to Wiley’s Decision Term Harmonization (DTH) initiative in September 2023. This effort involved a core set of recommendations and decisions across Wiley journals for comparison purposes. After working with the new decision terms, we identified some needs and requested three new options. Wiley was amenable to our requests. The greatest changes resulting from DTH involve the opportunity to transfer rejected papers, either when they go through review or when they are desk rejected. Many of these are referred to RMIR.

h. Mehr Award

Each year ARIA presents the Robert I. Mehr Award to the author(s) of the *JRI* article “that has best stood the test of time” among the articles published ten years ago. Papers appearing in 2014 (volume 81 of the *Journal*), therefore, were considered for the 2024 award.

As was our process last year for determining the award winner, three Senior Editors—this year, Greg Niehaus, George Zanjani, and Nicolas Ziebarth—served on a subcommittee that spent considerable time and effort to appraise finalists. The criteria to determine finalists included:

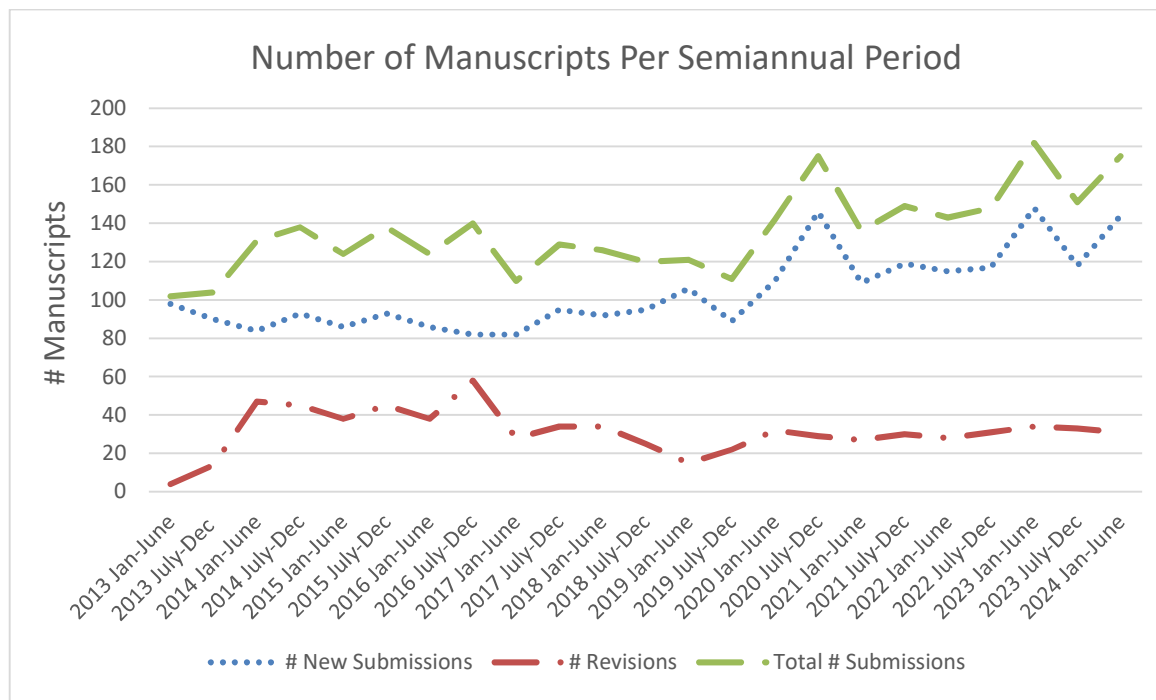
- Citations (Web of Science & Google Scholar)
- The prestige of the journals that cited the papers
- Breadth of relevance
- Survey/review article versus new research
- Subjective assessment of contribution

All editorial board members who did not have an article in the volume under consideration were provided a list of the 34 eligible articles, the abstract, citation information, and a web link to the article in JSTOR. A virtual meeting of the editorial team allowed for a discussion of each finalist paper along with any others proposed by the editorial team. Members of the editorial team were able to ask questions and offer their impressions. They were subsequently asked to rank order their top three articles from the full list. The paper with the highest score was selected as the recipient of the 2024 Mehr Award.

The selection process yielded Amy Finkelstein and James Poterba as the 2024 Robert I. Mehr Award recipients for their article “[Testing for Asymmetric Information Using ‘Unused Observables’ in Insurance Markets: Evidence From the U.K. Annuity Market](#)” Vol. 81, No. 4 (December 2014), pp. 709-734. We congratulate the authors, and are delighted that Jim Poterba is attending the meeting to do a plenary for us and to receive the award. We are incredibly grateful to George Zanjani and Nicolas Ziebarth for their effort, and especially to Greg Niehaus who has taken on this task each of the past three years. Their efforts have been substantial and valuable.

## 2. Submission and Publication Statistics

The *Journal* continues to have a strong and generally increasing flow of manuscripts, with 267 new manuscripts received during the 2023 calendar year and 144 new manuscripts submitted during the first six months of 2024. Below is a visual of manuscript submissions and distributions in six-month intervals since *JRI* began using ScholarOne in January 2013.



Backlog has been declining in recent years. As of July 1, 2024, 15 articles accepted for publication have not yet appeared in the print edition.

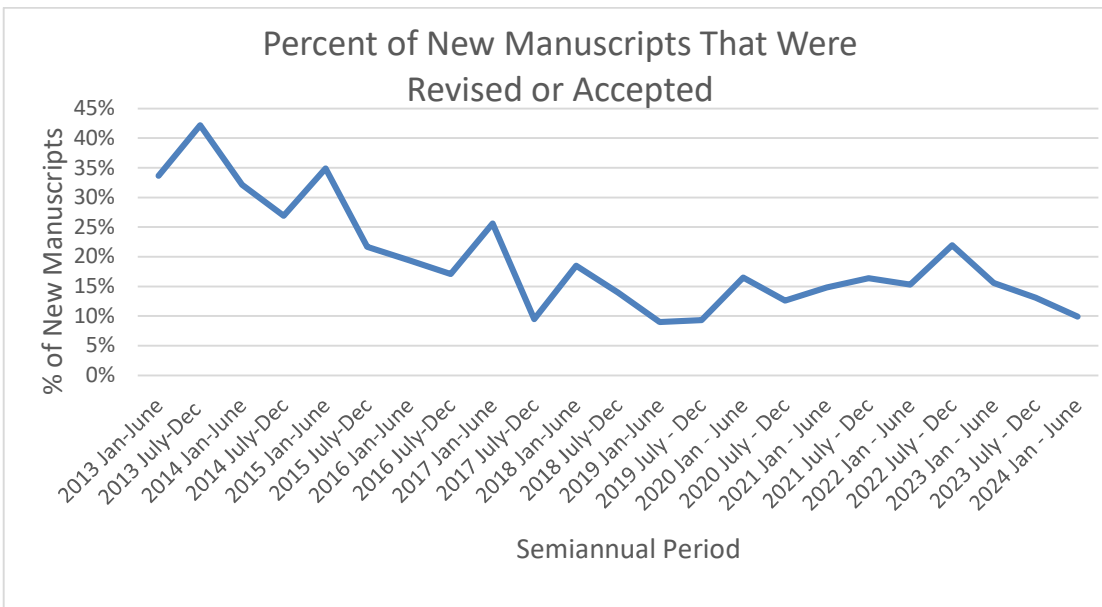
### Disposition of Original Manuscripts: January 1, 2013 to November 30, 2024

The disposition of original manuscripts is shown in the table below.

The frequency of positive first decisions has tightened since 2013, with a leveling at approximately 15%. Since implementing ScholarOne in January 2013, *Journal* editorial offices have processed 2,352 new submissions. Of the 2,352 new submissions received, 1,875 were rejected at the first decision, and 68 were rejected after revision. The *Journal* rejection rate since January 1, 2013, therefore, is approximately 82.6%.<sup>1</sup> The figure on the next page shows the percent of new manuscripts with a positive first decision.

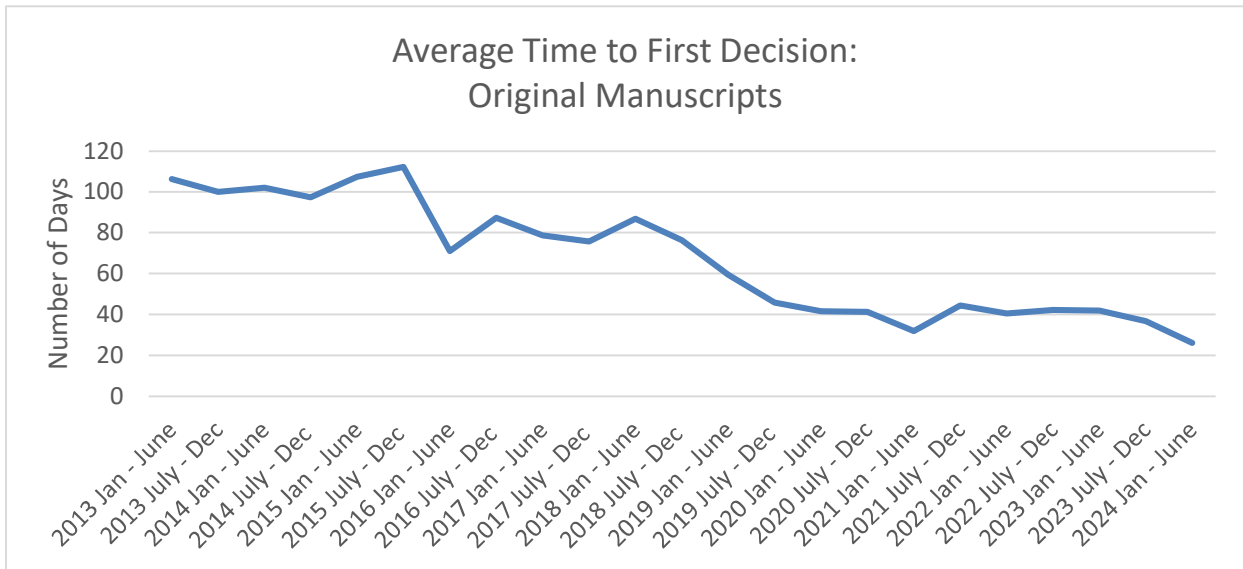

**Average Time to First Decision: January 1, 2013 to June 30, 2024**

The average time to first decision for original manuscripts is shown below. Included in the number of decided manuscripts are 151 that received “reject and resubmit” decisions.

Implementation of the reject and resubmit decision has been generally positive for the *JRI*; 79 of those papers have been returned to us, 27 have been accepted, and 8 are still in progress.



In summarizing the figure above and considering the data from 2019-2024 in the following table, we note that both the average and median total days to decision have decreased since January 2013.

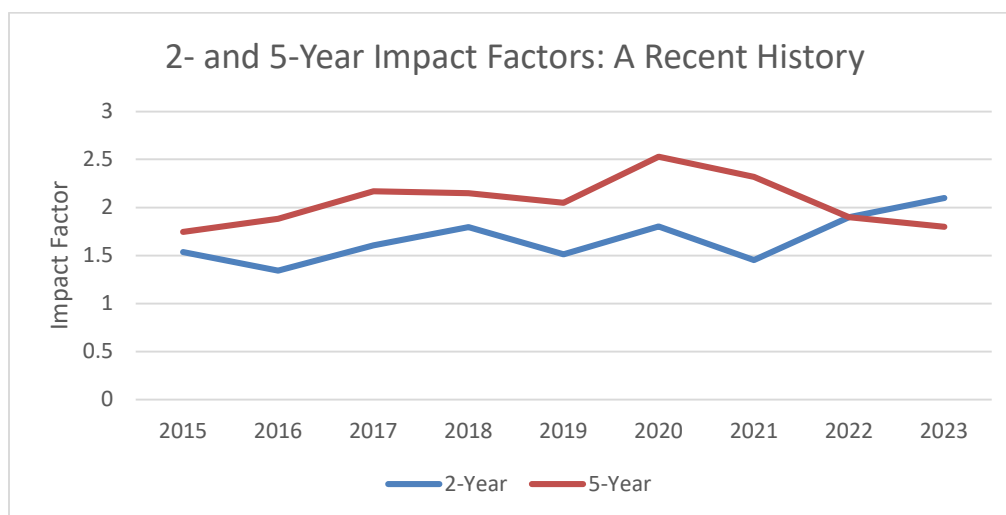

### 3. Measuring the *JRI*'s Influence

The impact factor, produced by the Journal Citation Reports of the Institute for Scientific Information, is often used to measure journal quality. The 2023 two-year impact factor is calculated by dividing the number of citations in 2023 from Web of Science journals of articles published in the *JRI* in 2021 and 2022 by the total number of articles published in 2021 and 2022. The 2023 impact factor is 2.1, an increase from the corresponding 2022 impact factor of 1.9. We believe this is the first time the *JRI* has had an impact factor greater than 2. The 2023 five-year impact factor is 1.8, slightly below the 2022 five-year impact factor of 1.9.

Recent history of the two- and five-year impact factors is included in the graph below. We believe that the continued focus on quality and efforts at outreach to extend the recognition of the *Journal* will ultimately improve the impact factor, including the 5-year impact factor.



We encourage all authors to place their papers on SSRN when submitting (or before submitting to) *JRI*. This will enhance the recognition of authors' papers and add to our citation reports.

The results for 2023 look good. The 2-year Impact Factor is the highest over the period evaluated, and ought to lead to a good 5-year Impact Factor with time. We believe this is the result of (1) an initiative to ensure that authors are including the most up-to-date papers in their bibliography; and (2) efforts to highlight *JRI* to others through social media and by sharing recently published articles with those who are cited.

We note as well that the *JRI*'s relative ranking has improved. Last year the *JRI* was 71 out of 111 in Business and Finance. This year the *JRI* is 93 out of 231. Additionally, in 2022, the *JRI* was 207 out of 380 in Economics, and in 2023, the *JRI* is 200 out of 597. We consider these to be good outcomes.

Additionally, according to the *Wiley's Publisher's Report 2023*, the number of full text article views for the *JRI* during 2023 increased by 16.4%, which was larger than the increase of 8.8% across all Wiley journals in the Finance and Investments subject area. The average number of *JRI* article views in 2023 was 534, as compared to the 665 average article views across all of Wiley's journals. Further, in 2023, *JRI* had 121,059 article views from Wiley Online Library as compared to 103,989 article views in 2022. Similarly, we see that from July 1, 2023 to June 30, 2024, there were 2,939 page views and 990 full paper downloads from the IDEAS (RePEc) web site, as compared to 2,426 and 725, respectively, in the previous 12 months. All articles published in the *Journal* are automatically listed at [IDEAS](#) as well as [EconPapers](#).

### Editorial Team

A team of Senior Editors and a talented Editorial Board began assuming responsibility to manage incoming manuscripts in January 2019. The input of each has been outstanding in extending the quality of the *Journal*.

### Original Manuscripts by Senior Editor: July 1, 2019 to June 30, 2024

The following table displays the Senior Editors, the number of manuscripts they managed, and their percentage of manuscripts when combining all papers. Several individuals accepted our request to serve as "acting senior editor" for special purposes. The total differs from what is shown in the "time to decision" table because this table includes withdrawn papers and those still under review.
